

The reputation "the Saviour of Verdun" earned among the men who knew him best is written in the records of that time. Jean le Bret of Montreal has assembled from them, the evidence that shows the 1914-18 Petain as he was.

Petain at Verdun was Marshal Joffre's headache. The quotes that follow are from Joffre's memoirs covering the period May - July, 1916. It was on May 2 that General Petain took command of the Centre Army Group and on June 3 I went to see him at Bar-le-Duc where his 2nd Army GHQ. Was. In the course of that visit his pessimism struck me and that state of his mind was confirmed for me not long after.

The resolute countenace of Foch when he came to GHQ calmed immoderate fears; the truth is that Petain once again had been already developed the

Verdun — July Petain, in the Spring of 1918, was the headache of the whole French Government.
