LEROY TOLL PRESENTS TRAVELLOGUE
LeRoy Toll, youthful Canadian adventurer whose thrilling life through the jungles of South America several years ago brought him world fame, presented an exciting travelogue at the R.C.A.F. camp here last night.
The son of Rev. S. L. Toll, London Ont., LeRoy Toll is giving up a two week holiday in order to entertain troops at eight Ontario military camps.
LeRoy and his brother Ellsworth first won fame as adventurers when, upon graduation from the University of Toronto, they climbed the globe by cattle boat, hitch-hiking and tramp steamer at a cost of \$75 each. FAIRBY BATTLE PILOT SHOWS SKILL IN MAKING PANCAKE LANDING
Exhibiting outstanding piloting skill, Flying Officer, R. G. Freyermouth, of Iowa, operating a Fairly Battle Bomber, in routine exercises on Sunday, made a perfect pancake landing two miles west of Port Dock on Sunday on a farm near the Lakeshore. The plane, on a routine flying exercise also carried two students, A.C. G. L. McDonald, Toronto, as observer, and L.A. C. J. H. Brown of La Tuque, Quebec, as gunner. The plane was forced to land when engine trouble developed. Flying Officer Freyermouth did an excellent job of landing the bomber without injury to himself and the other airmen and with so little damage to the plane was the command of Group Captain, C.O. No. 1 Bombing and Gunnery School here. In making the landing the pilot barely missed a large clump of trees after hitting the ground with the landing gear retracting a step fire. 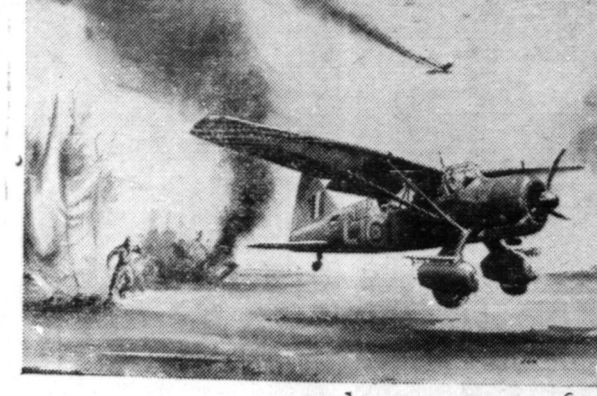
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BRITISH PILOT'S EXPLOIT: AN ARTIST'S IMPRESSION

Making sure there were no Germans near, he quickly landed the easily manoeuvrable Lysander, and it took the grounded pilot only a few seconds to free himself from the parachute and climb into the Lysander. Soon he was on his way home - to fight another day.
