How does this help the war effort? Let us use Haldimand as an example. During the period April to October of last year Haldimand farmers marketed 15047 pigs of which 14146 or 94 percent, were in the two top grades. It is impossible to know at what weights these pigs were marketed but for sake of argument let us suppose that 50 per cent weighed 190 to 200 lbs, or with an average of 195 lbs. live weight and yielding 146 lbs, per carcass. If these same pigs had been kept until they weighed 215 lbs and yielding 161 lbs. of carcass it would have meant 106,095 extra lbs of pork products for Britain without sacrificing grade.

There is an old saying that "the Lord helps those who help themselves," and it is equally true to say "the Lord helps those who help each other." Many Haldiman. each other." Many Haldimand farmers will in reality have to help farmers will in reality have to help each other this year if they are to maintain production anywhere near its normal leve! Last year there were a number of "One-man" farms and the number may even be increased this year. Many farmers co-operated in the old-fashioned neighbourly manner of changing work with each other and thereby saved the situation. It will be recalled that during severe farm labour shortages in the last war, neighbours worked back and forth helping each other with seeding and harvest operations. A return to this method and an extension of it during 1942 will enable farmers to erations. A return to this method and an extension of it during 1942 will enable farmers to piant and har-yest more crop acres, and feed more hogs and cattle than they would by

attempting to run the farm alone.

Will you have enough hay and pasture this year? If not, early consideration should be given to some annual crop that will yield well and make a good quality feed. Many crops have been tried and some of them are very satisfactory. More will be said of this matter later but if you are thinking of sudan grass (one of the good crops) you had better start looking for seed shortly. While there is a fairly plentiful supply it is not unlimited. It is sown at the rate of 30 lbs. per acree alone or with oats at 20 lbs. per acre. But more about this next time.
