A year ago to day the Duke of Kent stepped from a shining Douglas Bomber on an official visit of inspection of the Jarvis Bombing and Gunnery School. Today he too, has paid the price asked of all true citizens of democracy in preserving our way of life. He died on Tuesday when the Sunderland Flying Boat in which fie was travelling to Iceland crashed in northern Scotland, killing all mem bers of the crew as well.

The Duke's visit here a year ago endeared him to the hearts of all who were privileged to see him. Since the outbreak of war he has been bustly engaged in wartime duties, being attached to the staff of the Inspector General of the R.A.F. The fatal trip was an official visit of inspection which was taking the party with which he travelled to Iceland.
