Weekly War Commentary

News from the Solomons Islands indicated that American marines and regulars on Guadalcanal had inflicted severe losses on Japanese forces landed on the island and made their own position there "very secure."

A German admission Tuesday that Nazi defenses in the Stalingrad area had been penetrating strongly. While the Russians attacked fiercely in attempts to trap German armies in the Stalingrad area, Anglo-American forces in Tunisia and western Libya and Australia and American troops continued their drives against the Japanese in New Guinea and Guadalcanal.

The United Nations offensive in the Mediterranean will go forward with renewed power as a result of the announcement Monday that the British West Indies fleet, including the big naval base of Dakar, had been placed under the Allied banner.
