ADVISES FARMERS TO REPAIR BAGS. John D. MacLeod Says Every Care Should Be Taken of Present Supply. Farmers and others handling produce contained in jute and cotton bags should be well advised to carefully collect, clean and mend every available bag, says John D. MacLeod, Crop, Seeds and Weeds Branch, Ont. Department of Agriculture, Toronto. The supply is limited and every care should be taken of those on hand, he states.

Used bags may harbour and spread various plant diseases, so disinfecting is recommended, if one is doubtful regarding the cleanliness of bags, they may be dipped in a solution of formalin, one pint to 20 gallons of water for a period of three to five minutes.
