J. A. SOCIETY NAME FIELD CROP WINNERS

The Field Crop Competition by the Jarvis Agricultural Society in O.A.C. No. 21 Barley were judged last week by Mr. W. H. Eddy, of Burford and we have received the score from Mr. J. A. Carroll, Superintendent of Agricultural Societies, the following list of prize winners with the score of each contestant: 1st - A. E. Doughty, Naticoke, R. I. score 90.

Where the soil in the field is fairly uniform one composite sample is sufficient. If there are extreme changes in the character of the soil the samples from the various types should be kept separate.
