Officials in charge of Canada Second Victory Loan have raised their sights and are now going toward a new mark of \$900,000,000. The nominal and minimum goal of \$600,000,000 was passed at midweek with announcement that total subscriptions to close of business Tuesday amounted to \$615.298.750 from 798,727 subscribers. Appeals for over subscriptions were issued by Hon. J. L. Ilsley, Minister of Finance and G. W. Spinney, Chairman of the National War Finance Committee. Big new subscriptions made public the middle of the week included Noranda Mines Limited and Associated Companies for \$6,500,000.
