JUNIORS TO HOLD JUDGING COMPETITION

Plans are rapidly being completed for the annual Junior Farmers Livestock Judging Competition to be held at Hagersville on Saturday, May 30th according to an announcement which has just been recently issued by the Junior Farmer Association.

Classes of Livestock will be judged on the adjoining farms in that vicinity and it is expected that Junior Farmers from all municipalities will take advantage of this annual opportunity to get together.

A large number of trophies are up for competition as well as other cash prizes. Further details regarding the competition will be announced later.

RAN PLACED ON METALS FOR FARM EQUIPMENT

The recent order of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board re the conversion of metals in new farm equipment and the use of certain metals in the making of other farm equipment makes it clear that since the war it is to conserve for war use such metals as may be considered essential, and that no restriction is made in the use of metals that are absolutely necessary for efficient farm operation. There are also other items on the list.

In a further list of farm equipment, the use of rubber, aluminum, tubing and fittings for hand saws, lead, magnesium, nickel, tin, vanadium, zinc, cadmium, and molybdenum are prohibited, except for proper operation. The list of farm equipment includes cultivators, narrow discas, hoes, land rollers, ploughs, seed flur, weeders, seed drills, planters, binders, threshers, hay loaders, rakes, mowers, cream separators, milking machines, pumps, wind mill, mowing machines, grain cleaners, and many other items.

For example, rubber is permitted in tubing and fittings for hand saws, power sprayers, for bowling rings, power separators, and rubber wearing parts of milking machines and so on. Zinc, zinc, and copper are permitted where their use is necessary, the general idea being to prevent injury to present industry, and to facilitate the efficient operation of the equipment of the Administrator to grant special permission to manufacturers to use up during 1942 such quantities of metals as are now on hand and are needed for the purposes covered by the Order.
