Some indication of conditions there on the island was given in a statement by Paul V. McLane, former trade commissioner at Hong Kong, that "it seems pretty definite conditions are hard" in the prisoner camps.
Orders providing for compulsory employment of all persons capable of working were issued jointly by Labor Minister Mitchell and E. M. Little, Director of National Selective Service, August 31st. The new regulations became effective immediately and call-up quotas are already being determined by the two departments.

Selective service officials at employment offices have been authorized to summon anyone for interview and to point out more essential work than that in which he or she is now engaged. None can be hired, or interviewed, without a permit to seek a job.

Recently a few figures were made available to the writer which show that a certain producer took his 12 dozen eggs of one of the registered egg grading stations in the County. The eggs were not just what they might have been. There was a good many dirts. It was quite evident they had not been kept cool enough to prevent a drop in grade. Anyway, they averaged the producer 22.8 cents per dozen.

But the story doesn't end there. These facts were pointed out to the producer who was sensible enough to put into effect at least some of the suggestions made by the grader. The result? Five days later he brought in another 12 dozen crate which averaged 28.2 cents per dozen or an increase of 63 cents per 12 dozen. Does it pay to give your eggs reasonable attention? It does and you are also doing your "Bit for Britain" at the same time.
