BRACKEN'S POLICY

A hint of the policy he will follow in carrying out his work as leader of the Progressive Conservative party was given by John Bracken in addressing a gathering at Lacombe, Quebec during his first official visit to the province since he was named head of the Progressive Conservative party at the Winnipeg convention last December.

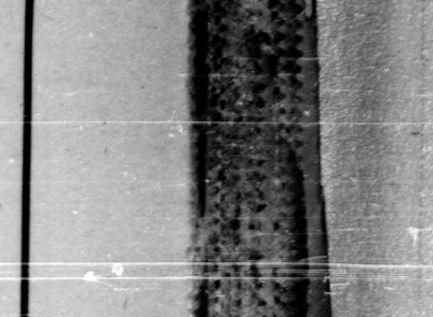

Contrary to rumors prevalent for some time that car drivers who were granted special categories or gasoline permits would not be permitted to do any pleasure driving it now appears that all motorists will have the same amount of gas for pleasure driving.
