Weekly War Commentary

Gordon Canadian Press Staff Writer Berlin reports early this week indicated that the British 8th Army might shortly resume the offensive against Axis forces north of Greece. British gunners were reported to be laying down test shots on enemy defence positions while tanks were said to have been moved near the front.

British, Canadian and Allied planes are pounding enemy targets in Japanese warships and other vessels in the Far East and in two attacks on the coast of Sumatra. Saturday night, German forces were subjected to a heavy attack and the following day American flying fortresses smashed the Renault plant at Paris while R.A.F. and R.C.A.F. bombers were over the Rabaal in New Britain, heretofore one of the most-bombed bases for Japanese aircraft and naval vessels.
