

WHAT SCIENCE IS DOING

More than 3,000,000 Ameri cans, many in the prime of life, uffer from arthritis, one of the most prevalent chronic disabling diseases in that nation, as it also is in Canada, says The Stratford Beacon-Herald. But favorable results obtained with a relatively new treatment of 250 cases of new treatment of 200 cases of the most crippling form of arthri-tis are reported in the current issue of Industrial Medicine by Drs. R. G. Snyder, Willard H. Squires and John W. Forster of the Hospital for Special Surgery,

New York City. The patients, subjects in a sixyear study, previously had failed to respond to the more common forms of therapy. Then they were given the new treatment—huge doses (from 200,000 to 300,000 units per day) of Vitamin D in the form of an electrically activated heat-vaporized ergosterol (Ertron is the trade name). Over extended periods the patients continued to take the capules by mouth.

The article charts detailed effects of the vitamin treatment in 50 serious cases. On the basis of a check made from two to three years after the drug was first administered, results in 22 cases were good or excellent, results in eight cases poor, and the rest either fair or undetermined because patients moved away. In some instances persons whose joints appeared hopelessly stiffened and swollen were able to resume their normal occupations; one was able to play golf again, another, a star tennis player who had been unable to rise from a sitting position, resumed his game, and a third, all of whose joints were affected, made a complete recovery." The physicians say that while

"Ye shall not steal; neithe shall ye deal falsely, nor lie one to another." A man who will steal

will lie; stealing generally nece sitates lying, in an attempt cover up the evil deed. "And ye shall not swear by my name falsely, and profane the name of God: I am Jehovah." This is a warning against that sin into which men are so prone to fall-

the careless and profane use of the name of God. Impartial Judgment
"Thou shalt not oppress thy eighbor, nor rob him: The wages of a hired servant shall not abide with thee all night until morning. This benign care for the laborer, and the denunciation against any attempt to defraud him, are again and again repeated in the Scrip

"Thou shalt not curse the deaf, nor put a stumblingblock before the blind; but thou shalt fear thy God: I am Jehovah." The prohibition against injustice to the infirm and the poor is enforced by an appeal to fear the Lord. "Ye shall do no unrighted

"Neither shalt thou s t a n d against the blood of thy neighbor: I am Jehovah." One must not be a false witness to the en-dangering of a man's life or stand by without an effort to save him from ruin or danger.

"Thou shalt not hate thy brother in thy heart: thou shalt surely rebuke thy neighbor, and not bear sin because of him. Thou shalt not take vengeance, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people; but thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself: I am Je-neighbor as thyself: I am Jehovah." We are forbidden to avenge the wrong even when the rebuke has proved ineffectual.




