



The Weekly Diet For Soldiers, Sailors

A soldier or a sailor eats about

one and a half times as much as a civilian, says the St. Thomas Times-Journal. He reduces civilian supplies only by the differences between what he ate as a civilian and what he eats now—the dif-ference between 5¼ pounds a day compared with 3¾ pounds in civil life. The U.S. War Food in civil life. The U.S. War Food Administration says the average weekly diet for a man in training includes: 6 1-5 pounds of meat; 7 eggs; 3½ pounds of fresh milk; 1½ pounds of evaporated milk; ice cream once a week; at least 1 pound of butter, margarine and other fats; 4½ pounds of bread, cereal and other grains; require at least a three-moni reserve supply; for men abroad nine-month supply.
