Glass Plastics A new material is employed in aircraft construction. It is a plas-tic reinforced with glass fibers.

Samples have been produced with a tensile strength of over 80,000 pounds per square inch. While the impact strength of ordinary plasties is about 2 foot-pounds, samples of the glass and plastic combination have shown impact resistance of over 20 foot-pounds. 




