## WHAT SCIENCE IS DOING

FLYING MINESWEEPER almost literally filled the waters of the English channel with a new bey in the Christian Science Monitor. This mine, designed for use in shallow waters, was made of non-magnetic materials and employed a detonating device so contrived that the mine was exploded when the steel hull of a ship pass-

ed over the mine, deflecting a Various suggestions were made for combating this magnetic type of mine. The British considered towing large sheets of metal the mined waters by means of non-magnetic woodenhulled ships. The wooden ships would not affect the mines but the metal plate would activate the magnetic detonating mechanism exploding the mine.

. . . Another suggestion involved tov ing a cable equipped with magnetic devices and sound maker which happened to be of the acous the cable would set up an elecne magnetic mines.

Still a third means of detonating magnetic mines harmlessly was by means of aerial minengton bombers for this purpose. huge rings which had a diameter almost equal to the length of the bomber. Installed beneath the plane, the ring could be charged with electricity, transforming it into a powerful magnet.

The electricity required to energize the magnetic ring was generated by means of auxiliary motors, it being impractical to divert sufficient power from the plane's regular motors to run the genera-
