these days is highly coloured and these days is highly coloured and tainted yolks and whites which are usually the result of permitting the birds to roam at will and eat anything and everything. Certain weeds and grasses are said to cause trouble and the drinking of dirty water may cause a strong flavour. Keeping the birds confined until they have had a good feed of mash and grain and providing plenty of clean water will generally correct this aggravating situation.

and one operator reports ninety-five per cent of the trouble as coming from lack of straw in the nests, crowding and weak thin shells.
There is little excuse for not providing good well-filled clean nests. ing good well-filled clean nests. To prevent crowding a good rule is to provide one nest for every four to six hens. Plenty of shell building material along with the proper food ration will go a long way in preventing weak thin and misshapen shells.
