ON THE FARM FRONT. (continued from page one) these days is highly coveted and usually the result of permitting the birds to roam at will and eat anything and everything. Certain weeds and grasses are said to cause trouble and the drinking of dirty water may cause a strong flavour. They have had a good feed of mash and grain and providing plenty of clean water will generally correct this aggravating situation.

Cracked eggs are C grade eggs and one operator reports ninety-five per cent of the trouble as coming from lack of straw in the nests. There is little excuse for not providing good well-filled clean nests. To provide one nest for every four to six hens. Plenty of straw is important along with the proper food material along with the proper food.

A little attention to these matters will mean increased poultry revenue and increased quantities of eggs. Only grain that is broken for the manufacture of egg powder.

Be on the watch for new weeds. That is good advice at any time. Time, especially important in war-time which is spreading in Ontario are two factors of great concern. So far as we know no new weeds have been reported in Ontario. However, if you find a new one, take a representative and find out what it is.

On the Farm Front. Blot takes a heavy toll from our Haldimand herds every year and we cannot afford to lose these cattle at any time, much less now when heavy demands are being made for more milk and meat. A recent report issued by an American group tends to throw some light on the subject but draws no definite conclusions nor does it make any specific recommendations.

Blotting would seem to be a physical problem and largely the result of eating too much too quickly. As far as control is determined there is no poison connected with the condition. No matter what cows eat they continually form gas which if absorbed might kill a cow but normally a cow belches from time to time and rids herself of this gas. However when the opening of the stomach becomes blocked with food bloating is bound to result.

According to this report there were no so-called "bloat remedies" that were really effective. Anything strong enough to prevent gas formation interfered with digestion and should not be used. It was felt however, that cows should not be turned out to lucous green pasture or to a field of alfalfa. It is off their appetite by feeding heavy lush pastures. It would also be better to let the cow drink before going on a legume pasture rather than alfalfa.

Dry cows seldom bloat. It is the milking cow, the "heating" cow, the cow that is "farming" or "harvesting". It is the policy of the Ration Administration to provide temporary rations for persons whose employment is less than two weeks.

If a drench is used, follow the directions of your veterinarian. The plan should be to prevent the formation of more gas and to eliminate that already formed. In extreme cases it may be necessary to use the "toxic" or "killed". This should be inserted on the left side at the highest point of the flank.

"Please pass this." Many farm animals would perhaps wish to make that request. This is particularly true in the case of the cow on heavy production. Each pint of (continues on page eight)
