"BUS TRAVEL MAY HAVE TO BE RATIONED" C. J. Gravelle Points to Heavy Burden on Bus Systems. Estimating that 8,000,000 passengers will be carried on the buses of the Canada Coach Lines this year, an increase of 2,000,000 over 1942, C. J.
