With the forwarding today of a draft for \$10,700.32 Canadian Holstein breeders have brought the total of their gifts sent to Britain during the past three years for war relief to \$24,677.34. In 1941 they raised \$11,844.16 and in 1942 \$1,900. As in the two previous years, the total of the 1941 and 1942 funds were used for clothing and otherwise relieving the distress of merchant sailors whose ships and personal belongings had been lost in the Battle of the Atlantic.
