Ottawa, July 28 - (CP) - Arrange ments for detailing men from army units to help relieve labor shortages in agriculture were sketched in the House of Commons by Defence Minister Ralston last Saturday, the day when parliament ended a six-month session and adjourned till January 26th.

one subsequeent announcement has already been made by Labor Minis-ter Mitchell.

The decision to detail groups of

men will not interfere with the pre-sent practice of allowing compas-sionate leave to soldiers to engage in farm work, Col. Ralston said. The in farm work, Col. Ralston said. The granting of compassionate leave is being decentralized, with authority given to district officers commanding in an effort to reduce delays.

The proposal was forwarded to the provinces by Mr. Mitchell who asked their co-operation on a 50-50 partnership basis with the federal government. Mr. Mitchell said the army pay and allowances of men detailed would be continued. The wages paid by the farmer would be collected by the government and after the return of the men to their unit they would receive the differ-

Benito Mussolini

Announcement of the ousting of Premier Benito Mussolini of Italy and his Fascist cabinet was hailed with jubilation ithroughout Allied countries Sunday. It marked the first big crack in the foundations of the Fascist structure built up in Europe by the Axis powers.

It is too early to predict Italy's future course in the war, but undoubtedly dramatic events may be doubtedly dramatic events may be expected to follow King Victor Emmanuel's appointment of Marshal Pietro Badoglio to form a military government. The new government was given full power by the king.

Prime Minister Churchill told the House of Commons Tuesday that "we shall continue to make war on Italy from every quarter as long as she continues to side with the Germans."

"The keystone of the Fascist arch has crumbled," said the Prime Minister. "Without attempting to prophesy it does not seem unlikely that the entire Fascist edifice will fall to the ground in ruin if it has not already done so."

Rumors regarding the new Italian government's plans flew like wildfire through European capitals. Stockholm heard that preliminary aegotiations for an armistice were started in Vatican City Monday, but this report, like all others, lacked confirmation. [Demonstrations against Fascism occurred in several Italian towns and cities and bloodshed was reported at Milan where German troops fired on the crowds. Mussolini's downfall came after 21 years of dictatorship. Marshal Pietro Badoglio, 71, is a former chief of staff of the Italian army. It is believed he never gave his outright support to Fascism and he was dismissed by Mussolini in 1940.
