Two Airmen Still Live After Crashing in Disabled Plane. On the Farm Front

Haymaking will soon be upon us, and while the injunction to "make hay while the sun shines," is good advice, one of the farmer's most troublesome problems is to make hay before the sun dries it out. This is an important factor always to remember in haymaking is quality and the hay and straw must be of good quality. Good hay is green hay which is not matted or knotted or having any mouldiness or mustiness to it.

There is naturally a wide divergence of opinion as to the proper time to cut any kind of hay. There are so many factors to be considered. However, it does seem to be pretty well agreed that early cut hay provides a better feed of higher digestibility and protein content and furnishes more aftermath pasture than late cut hay.

Since protein is such an important factor in our livestock feeding this year, at least some consideration should be given to the protein content of various stages of growth. Some recently published figures show that alfalfa in the bud or in bloom stage often contains as high as 18 to 20% protein on an air-dry basis. At full bloom this drops to 15 to 16% and at full bloom to 12 to 14%. The best rule to follow is to cut hay early consistent with ease of curing.

The curing of the crop is simple with good weather conditions. However, our season continues to be a bit showery, our difficulties are greatly increased. However, there are many countries in the world where the season is generally cool with high humidity and frequent showers. In those countries haymaking results itself almost entirely to the clover and alfalfa. This is a very laborious and costly. Our nearest approach to this is the triple method of curing hay. This method is a good many farmers, it too, takes a lot of labour and for that reason more than anything else has never become very popular.

There is a real problem in this war, as well as in the past, and this would seem to be particularly true in this season of 1943. Weeds have the ability of making growth even under the most adverse conditions and so (continued on page ten)
