With the season becoming progressively later, more and more Haldimand farmers are considering alternative crops as a solution to the feed problem. Most farmers agree that late season oats are rarely very satisfactory. Barley may be a substitute but even for this crop the season is rather late. What then? Are there any late sown crops that can be successfully grown?

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In Haldimand we are fairly familiar with the value of corn as a silage crop. It is doubtful if we have heard much of it as a grain crop. In 1941, the average yield per acre of husking corn in this county was 10.3 bushels. The average yield of this is the equivalent of a 70 bushel crop of oats. In 1942 a test plot was conducted on the farm of Alex. Hedley and Sons, near Canby, where a 20 bushel yield of hybrid corn was grown side by side. The average yield of all varieties was 10.37 bushels of shelled grain per acre. This would be hard to conceive of in a wet year that would equal that in wet years.
