Starting today householders must use the Brown spare A coupons in their ration books to secure their supplies of meat, the latest commodity to be added to the rationed list in Canada.

Coupon No. 1 becomes good on May 27th and expires on June 30. Each week thereafter the next coupon becomes valid. While numbers are in pairs, they do not have to be used in pairs, but anytime during their date of validity.

Tea and coffee coupons No. 7 and 8 become valid today as well as No. 7 and 8 sugar coupons. Butter coupons No. 12 and 13 also become valid today.

BRIEF NOTES FOR THE BUSY FARMER

Last week a couple of substitute crops were mentioned to replace oats and barley because of the lateoats and barley because of the late-ness of the season. Two more that might have been discussed are em-mer and buckwheat. The first of these (often referred to as speltz) is not widely grown these days. It belongs to the wheat family and strange to say can be sown quite late. The limiting factor here seems to be the securing of suffi-cient good seed. cient good seed.

Buckwheat is too well known to need much comment here. It will grow on a wide variety of solis and may be seeded as late as July 1st. Earlier seeding however usually gives better results. Buckwheat is generally not considered quite as satisfactory for most classes of livestock as some of our cereals but it can be used to advantage up to one-third of the ration.
