U.F.O. Merge With F.O.A.

The 30-year-old history of the United Farmers of Onterio appears to have come to an end, the 30th annual convention here last week vot-ing to merge the organization and membership with the Ontario Feder-ation of Agriculture.

Thus the U.F.O. members, through

A., will become part of the Dominion wide Canadian Federation of Agricul ture. The unification of the two bodies is expected to be completed next month at the federation's annual meeting. "We are not dying, we are taking on new life — renewed youth." President D. E. Stauffer said in his convention address.

Thus there slips from the public scene an organization which hit its high spot in 1919 when a bid for political power in the province was successful. The U.F.O. gained 44 seats to 29 for the Liberals and 25 for the Conservatives and set up a U.F.O. - Labor government with the support of 11 Labor candidates who were successful in the election.

However, administrative inexperience plus a public scandal spelled the doom of that government which suffered overwhelming defeat at the polls in 1923, the Conservatives winning 77 seats to 17 for the U.F.O. and 14 for the Liberals.


