STOP PRESS NEWS

Canadians purchased \$55,857.00 in Victory Bonds Tuesday, bringing the cumulative total for the first two days to \$128,587.15. Today's cumulative total is \$8,341,000 greater than the sales in the first two days of the last loan but still falls below the required daily average of \$66,666.66 required to put the loan over the top.
