### A WAR JOB

NO JOB is of greater importance than the one undertaken by the Victory Loan Salesmen who started out on their job on Monday morning. Five men are canvassing the Jarvis district this year, namely, Rev. W. H. Fuller, E. R. Swain, L. R. Dougherty, George W. Walker and E. H. Arnold. Before three weeks have expired they will be expected to call on every potential bond buyer in the district and to have raised at least \$180,000.00.

It is a big job and before they are through they will likely experience many incidents which would tax the courage of Mountbatten's Commandos. Fortunately the people are becoming more conscious of the importance of buying bonds with each succeeding loan. But the fact remains there are still some who regard Victory Loan salesmen as a nuisance. These men are no nuisance. They are doing one of the most vital jobs in connection with the war. To fail in their objective would be just as disastrous to the Allied cause, as a defeat of the Allied Armies in Italy. The least we can do is to lend these salesmen every cooperation we can. in the world.

### THE TIE THAT BINDS

ONE OF THE FEW tangible good effects of the war has been the strengthening of the ties between Canada and the British Isles from the traditional bonds of empire unity to the hard, solid friendship of one man for another. Our soldiers, sailors and airmen fighting in the European theatre of operations are solely responsible.

Of course, all Canadians don't like all Britons — a completely logical fact reflecting on neither the Canadians nor the British, because all Canadians don't like all other Canadians, either. But in the nearly four years Canada's air force has struck from Britain blows at the Axis-held continent, and Canada's navy has helped keep the Atlantic sea routes open, every one of those Canadian fighting men has made many sound and lasting friendships among Englishmen, Irishmen, Welshmen and Scots.

Because of the very length of time this war has been in progress, these friendships will last. An association of four years isn't forgotten in the mere span of a few thousand miles of water that will separate the friends when peace comes. And in the future, when some Knotty British problem needs understanding in Canada, our veterans of this war will be the ones who will see the British point of view most readily.

Similarly, Canadian problems will be better understood by the British, because after this war, Canada, to Britons, won't just be a country in North America, it will be the country where each Briton knows and likes someone. That is the way trust is born.

Even stronger will be the ties between British and Canadian families who have been united in marriage. There are dozens of British girls in Canada now, some with their children, wives of Canadians who married in Britain and brought their wives back to this country. There are thousands to follow when the war is over.

The sum of all these friendships, and the various forms they take, cannot help but be an immense force for good in post war relations between Canada and her mother countries.
