Jerusalem. Old Testament Law "Think not that I came to des troy the law or the prophets: came not to destroy, but to fulfil." Not merely were the require ments of Moses to continue in force, but also all that was taught by the other inspired writers, the prophets. No part of the existing scriptures was to be set aside. "For verily I say unto you. Till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass away from the law, till all things be accomplished." The expression one jot or one tittle has been aptly compared to our English saying,-the dot of an 'i' or the cross of a 't'.

"Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, shall be called least in the 'kingdom o eaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven." If a man teach that any commandment of God is unimportant, pos-sibly behind his teaching is the fact that he himself is breaking that commandment. No man teaches a commandment with power if he is breaking it in his own life

True Rightrousness
"For I say unto you, that except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no wise enter into the kingdom of . eaven." God is the absolute and eternal standard of right. Consequently, human conduct is righteous, as it conforms to His will and approximates to His character.

Christ's Answer "And behold, one came to him and said, teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life? And he said unto him, why askest thou me concerning that which is good? One there is who is good: but if thou wouldest enter into life, keep the commandments." Christ knew that what this man wanted was a master, and man has only one Master—God whose commandments must be kept.

"He saith unto him, which? and Jesus said, Thou shalt not kill. Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Honor faiher and thy mother; and Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyseif." Disobedience to these laws means sin in the sight of God. "The young man saith unto him, all these things have I observed what lack I yet?" The young man






