

vvv One decided improvement is the method of paying the Provincial subsidy and Dominion premium. The Provincial subsidy of \$1.00 for A's and fifty cents for B's will now be paid with the Dominion premium and it will no longer be necessary to make application for same. These premiums will now be paid by means of warrants attached to the grading certificates. These warrants will be negotiable at par at any charterrtificates. 
This became effective on April 10 and any sursidy owing on account of hogs marketed previous to that date will be paid on receipt of applications properly completed. Grading service is being extended to domestic packing plants and hogs marketed through these channels will be eligible for the premiums.


Highest returns are received for A carcasses weighing 170 lbs. The 200 · 210 pound hog of the right type yielding a carcass of 150 - 160 lbs. is the most desirable and the safest proposition for the farmer. Canada definitely does not want heavy light or fat hogs. The production of extra weight and excess fat has become an expensive proposition has become an expensive proposition for the producer. This can be eas-ily shown by comparing the values of hogs in various weight ranges.

Creamery butter production across Canada dropped 10 per cent during March as compared with March 1943. Combined with this, the domestic disappearance of creamery butter in February represented the tremendous increase of 62.5 per cent as compared with the same month of last year.

Most seed corn dealers in the county now have their supply of seed for this season and farmers are warned to take delivery of their requirements now. There may be a shortage of certain maturities and it will be pretty much a case of first come first served.







