

Gardiner, also tells of a number of changes in the system of hog marketing as a result of disoussions between the Bacon Advisory Committee on Agriculture, the Meat Board and the Agricultural Food Roard

The procedure under which a basic price was established for B1 hog carcasses and prices for other grades determined by applying discounts, except in the case of Grade A carcasses for which a premium was paid by the packers, will be discontinued.
Hogs will be purchased on the
basis of their carcass values in premiums will be paid in the case of Grade A carcasses at \$3.00 a carcass, and in the case of Grade Bi at \$2.00 a carcass. The premium of \$1.00 formerly paid by the packers on Grade A carcasses will be paid on the carcass grade value for export bacon.

The number of grades has been reduced by consolidating some of them. The grades now adopted are Grade A, Grades B1, B2, and B3, all B grades to sell at the

Small Bottles-From 2c to 3c per bottle, or from 48c to 72c per carton of 24 small.

Large Bottles-From 4c to 5c per bottle, or from 48c to 60c per carton of 12 large.

Wooden Lifeboat Defies Flaming Oil

catch fire even when passing through forty-foot flames in a sea coated with burning oil has been erfected for use by crews of toredoed tankers, many of whom perish in seas set ablaze by their burning cargoes, it was anperish in seas set ablaze by their burning cargoes, it was announced in Britain recently.

Its inventor, John Lamb, who was torpedoed seven times during the last war, and three companions tested it in a large pool covered with burning gasoline. The external temperature was 4,000 degrees Fahrenheit, and the crew within the asbestos and canvas canopy was subjected to 116 degrees, yet neither the crew nor the boat suffered.
