On the Farm Grant NEWS BRIEFS FOR THE BUSY FARMER - By Halldman Harry - Some one has said that at least 1 egg in every 25 gets broken or eaten by the hens before it is gathered. Perhaps the chief cause of this is too few nests. One nest for every five hens seems to be the best proportion according to tests. Frequently nests are provided with one nest to every 10 hens. This is not enough.

Laying records at various institutions show that 90 to 75 per cent of the eggs are laid before noon. If such is the case there is every reason to expect plenty of nesting being provided. This also would suggest a revision of the gathering hours. If eggs are to be gathered four times a day these gatherings might be at 9.30, 10.30 a.m. - noon and at night.

Netting material is also important. Good clean loose straw seems to be about as satisfactory as anything. Plenty of it will in a large measure prevent breakage and loss of eggs.

Farmers throughout Halldman county are urged to repair and rebuild old machinery now in order to save time in the rush season. New machinery quotas were increased for 1944 but manpower, shortage and shortage of certain parts will likely limit new farm machinery to about 1943 levels.
