## Trillion Dollar Mark

War Bill Will Pass

By the end of this year the cost of the war to all belligerent nations will be near the almost unimaginable total of a trillion dollars, says the Winnipeg Free Press. The bill will pass the trillion mark in 1945, according to figures compiled by the Tax Institute of New York. A trillion dollars is a million million or a thousand billion-a sum never used in human history before to reckon the cost of war or any other

The Tax Institute calculates that the Axis so far has spent about the same amount on the war as the United Nations. But the balance of expenditures is now shifting rapidly and this year the United Nations will spend \$150 billions as against an estimated total Axis expenditure of \$50 billions. It must be remembered, of course, that a dollar wages and living standards are higher.

#### Lend-Lease Trucks Aid Russian Drive

Nearly 250 planes, more than 230 tanks, and 7,000 other military motor vehicles a week were sent overseas from the United States to Allied nations during January and February under the Lend-Lease program, Leo. T. Crowley, United States Foreign Economic Administrator, reported.

Mr. Crowley credited tens of thousands of Lend-Lease trucks with playing a vital role in the Soviet westward drive in the Ukraine and Crimea.

Furthermore, Soviet - produced tanks were augmented in the ofiensive drives by Lend-Lease General Shermans, Mr. Crowley added. Since March 11, 1941, the United States has produced more than 165,000 planes, 59,000 tanks and 2,000,-000 other military vehicles, Mr. will buy more in the Axis countries than in the Allied countries, where United States retained four-fifths of the planes and two-thirds of the other equipment.
