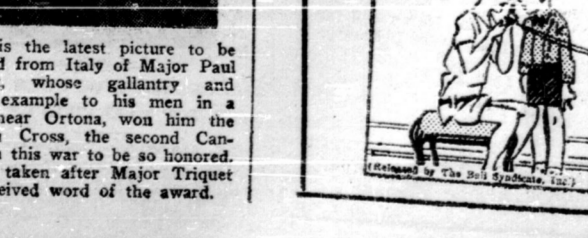

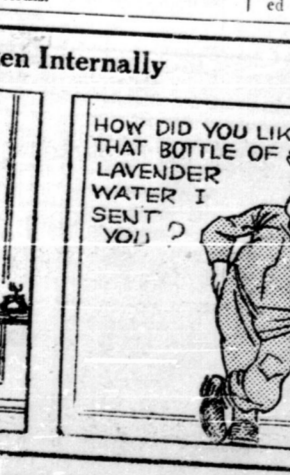

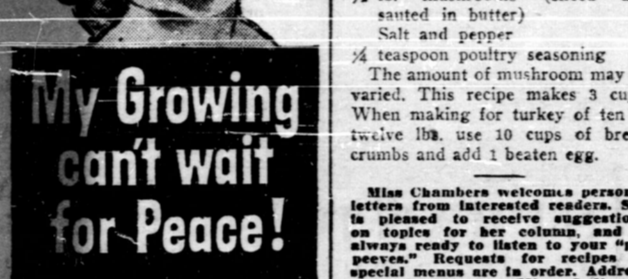

"And suppose I do sign?" said Loneragan, apparently weakening. "how do I know you're not planning to kill me afterward?"

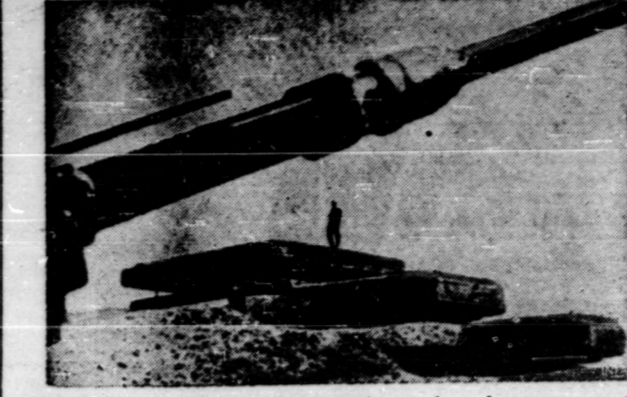

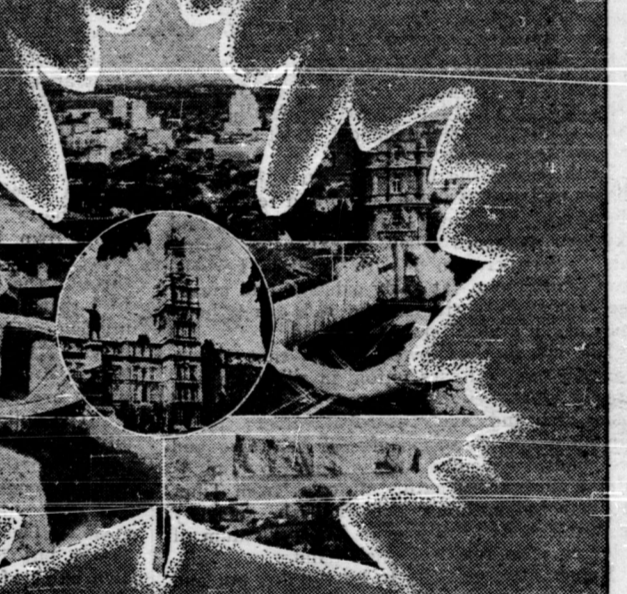
## Flak Suits Given Airmen in Pacific
