On Patrol Duty Coast guard helicopters have been on regular patrol and rescue assignment in the Third Naval Dis-trict for months, the U. S. coast guard announced recently, in reporting that pilots and mechanics are highly enthusiastic about the versatile though still experimental aircraft.




