CANADA'S TREATMENT AND PENSION LEGISLATION

Canada has assumed as a minimum obligation to members of the affiled forces that, before their return to civil life, the fullest possible measures shall be taken towards physical fitness, and that pension shall be provided for any permanent disability due to service. Full medical service is provided and veterors bospitale have been established from coast to coast. Equipment for the most modern types of treatment has been installed, and leading specialists in all here has of medicine and surgery have willingly placed their services. in all branches of medicine and surgery have willingly placed their services

the first year after return to civil life and free treatment with allowances for pensioned conditions is available throughout the pensioner's life. trestment may have their pay and allowances of rank continued for one year necessary and for longer when treatment is still required for a pensionable

Pension is awardable under three simple and easily understood conditions: 1. When the vereran has served in a theatre of war, death or any permanent

ility not due to misconduct is pensionable. 2. (a) When the veteran has served in Canada only, death or disability caused (b) Death or serious disability not due to service may be pensionable if pardship would otherwise result.

A very wide program of education is being carried on continuously so that veterans who suffer a disability as a result of their war service may have a full veterans who suffer a disability as a result of their war service may have a full and happy future. Many volunteer associations are assisting in this work, while specialized help is available from such organizations as the War Amputations of Canada, the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, and the Canadian Society for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.
