issued between October 14th and 21st

Distributing Centres will not be open on all days. Make sure that you know exactly what days and hours the Distributing Centre you intend to go to will be open. Failure to get your new book during distribution week will cause you inconvenience.

HOW TO GET YOUR NEW BOOK

Before you go to a Distributing Centre:

- Write your name and address on the front of the stub of the K coupon sheet in your Ration Book 4. The age of persons under 16 years must also be written in.
- Fill in your prefix and serial number on the back of the stub.
- Do NOT tear the K coupon sheet or stub out of the book. This must be done by an official of the Distributing Centre.

Take your Ration Book 4 with the K Coupon Sheet Attached and the Stub Properly Completed to a Distributing Centre and Your Ration Book 5 will be given you.

ARMED FORCES

Members of the Armed Forces will obtain their Ration Cards from their own units.

APPLYING FOR OTHERS

Any responsible persons may apply for Ration Books for other members of their families or neighbours, providing above requirements are complied with.

PARENTS MUST APPLY FOR CHILDREN

Children under 16 may not apply for their Ration Books of their own.

GREEK PEOPLE THANK RED CROSS

More than 4300 kits for Greek relief were shipped by the Women's War Work Committee, Ontario Division of Red Cross, since January. Because pitifully few infants survive the tragedy in Greece, only a small proportion of these were needed for children up to a year old. To Red Cross headquarters in Toronto, from the National Association of Hellenes in Great Britain has come a letter of thanks for the clothing. "I wish to thank you for this new shipment; according to the latest information the bulk of the clothing has already been forwarded. Our Alexandria friends wish us to convey to your society and the refugees heartfelt thanks for the many marks of sympathy and friendship which the noble people of Canada have shown on so many occasions towards the people of Greece." Mr. Metaxas explains that some of the clothing was distributed among Greek refugees in Alexandria and at Naxos in Palestine. Quilts will be of great use to the destitute and homeless Greeks when their homeland is freed and many of these made by Canadian Red Cross women are stored at the Hosiery and Knit Goods Store at 110 Dundas Street, pending despatch to their ultimate destination.

Pte. Bert Mitchell Killed In Fighting On Belgium Front

KILLED IN BELGIUM

Went Overseas In July Of This Year

Pte. Berkeley (Bert) Mitchell, husband of Helen E. Eason, of Simcoe, and son of George Mitchell and the late Mrs. Mitchell, of Walpole, has been killed in action in Belgium, according to official word received by his father yesterday. The advice from the Department of Records states he was killed on October 5th. Pte. Mitchell was erroneously reported missing August 27th, but this was corrected within a week. He enlisted for service in December 1942 and was trained at Brampton, Halifax and Calgary. He went overseas in July of this year, and was transferred to France the early part of August.

The deceased soldier was thirty-one years of age, and at the time of his enlistment was working on his father's farm. He has two brothers, Gordon of Welland, P.O. Lloyd Mitchell, with the R.C.A.F. on the East Coast and three sisters: Mrs. Clarence Atkinson, of Jarvis, Mrs. Harvey Reichold of Hagersville and Mrs. Margaret Smith of Toronto.
