Q. How can I resize an Axminster rug? A. Stretch the rug tight and tack face down on a floor, or some flat surface. Sprinkle with a solution made by soaking and dissolving 1/4 pound of flake glue in 1/2 gallon of water. Let the rug dry at least one day. Care should be taken not to put on so much glue that it will show on the right side.




