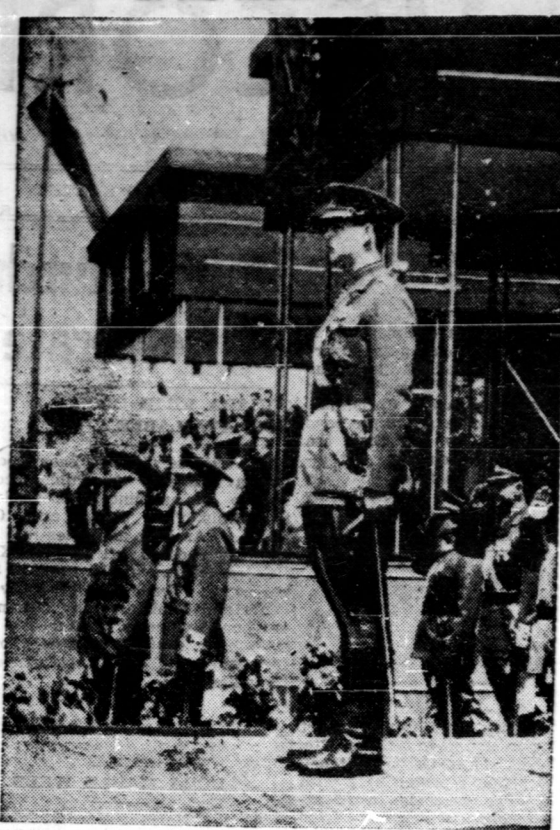
### Modern Etiquette

### WHAT SCIENCE IS DOING

#### Mineral Oil

Increased use of mineral oil during the war may have serious nutritional consequences, warns the United States Department of Agriculture. Mineral oil is said to rob the body of at least two of the fat-soluble vitamins and of calcium and phosphorus.

Mineral oil, which has been plentiful and relatively cheap, and does not become rancid, has been used in increasing amounts in salad dressings and in salted nuts, potato chips and doughnuts. Its prolonged use may lead to deficiency of vitamins A, but also of Vitamin D, the "sunshine vitamin," and calcium and phosphorus. Rats taking mineral oil needed three times as much cod liver oil to supply Vitamin D as those not getting the oil. Puppies fed mineral oil could not use the calcium and phosphorus in their food to build normal bones.

### Blackouts Lifted

The blackout has been lifted completely along the whole coastal belt of South Africa. The duties of the civilian coastal defence corps have been suspended.

Malta, once the most-bombarded spot on earth, ended its blackout last week on the anniversary of the great siege by the Turks in 1565.

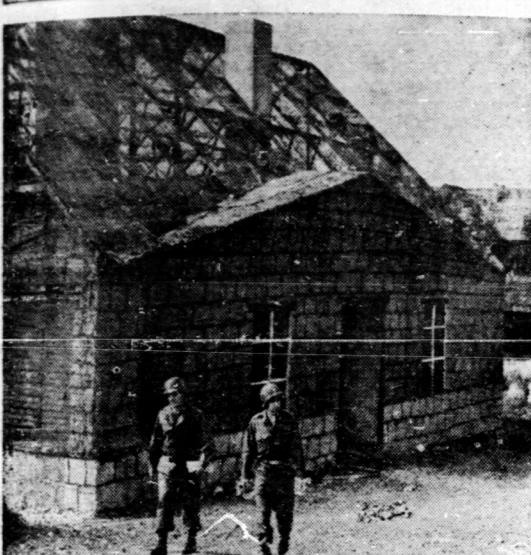
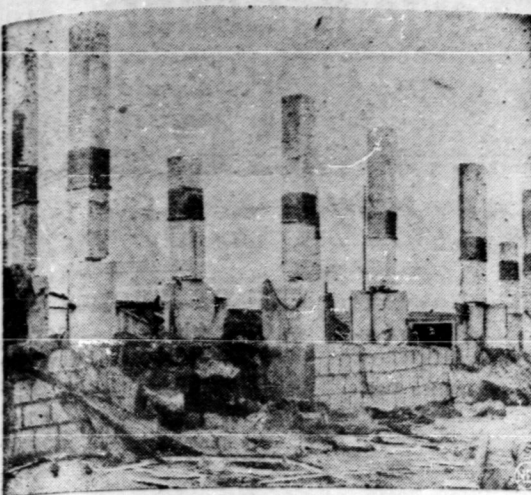

The "ruins" conceal large underground barracks. Also built to hide subterranean quarters was the "farmhouse" in bottom photo. 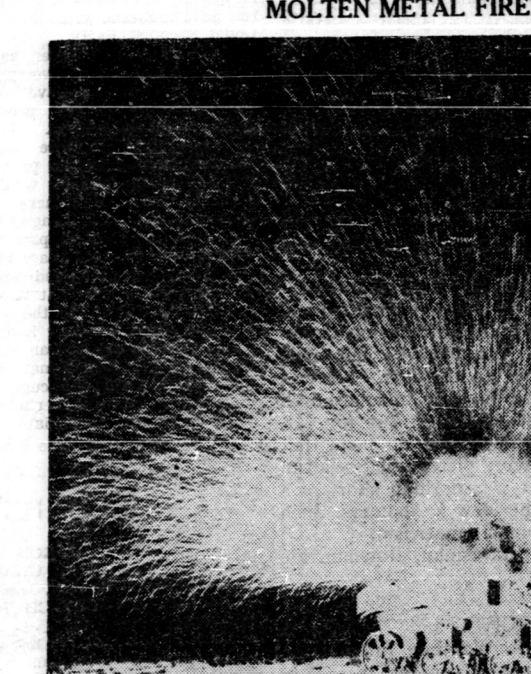
