This expansion, it may be noted, was accomplished entirely by pri-vate enterprise, without the intervention of a state trust and without aid-often, indeed, despite state discouragement in the form of restrictive taxes and curbs on investment.

#### Fire Bombs Set Jap Cities Aflame

The U. S. Army recently proved disclosure of details of the new M-69 incendiary bombs dropped by American Superfortresse on Tokyo and other Japanese cities. The new bombs are about 19 inches long, as big around as a aseball bat, and weigh six pounds. The interior contains a cheese-cloth sack filled with "gasoline jell", which burns for 8 to 10 minutes at temperatures above 6,000 degrees Fahrenheit.

The bombs are made up in 500-
