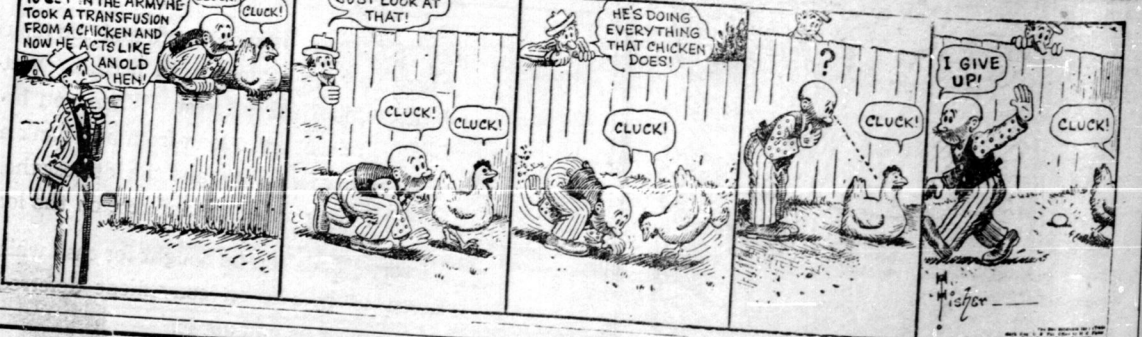

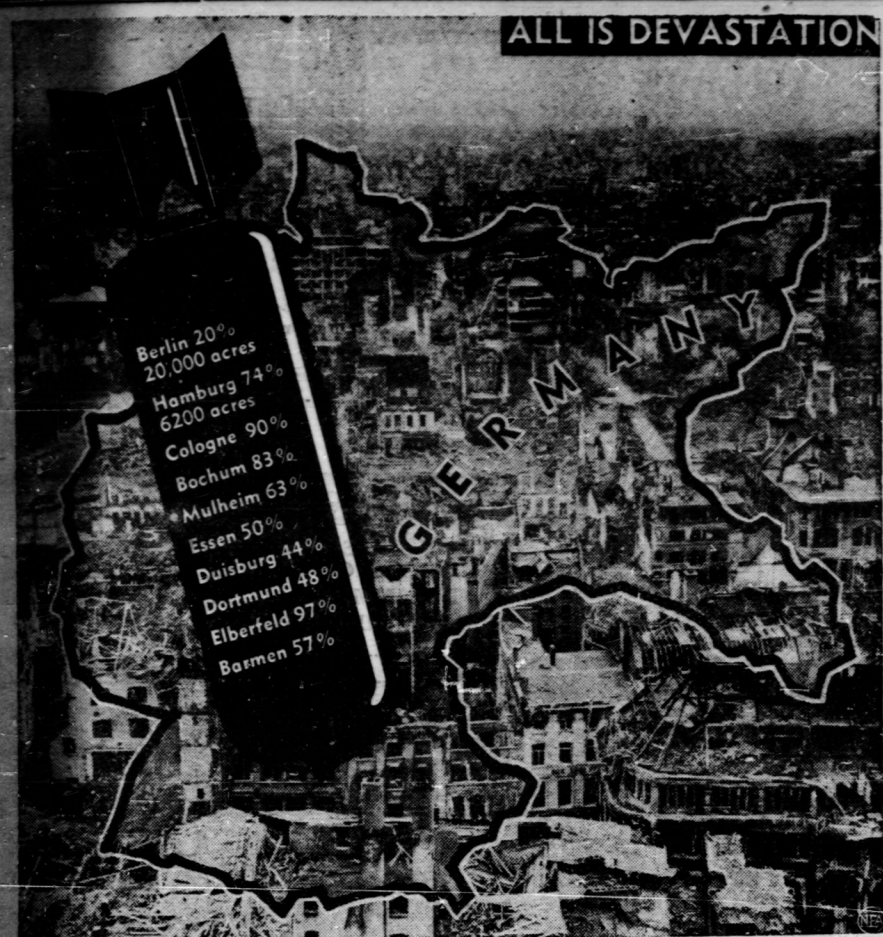

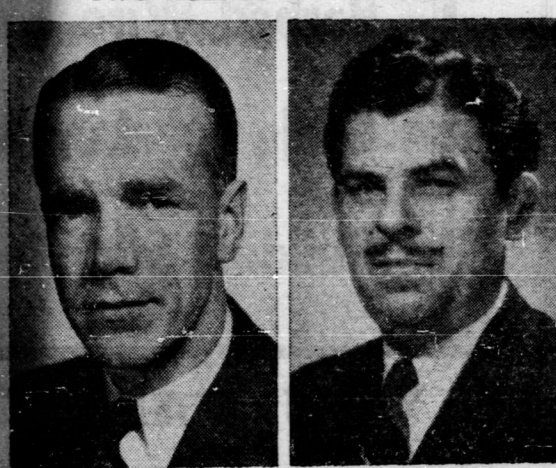


SO LONG, OLD CHAP, IF YOU MUST GO!

### TWO AGENCY APPOINTMENTS



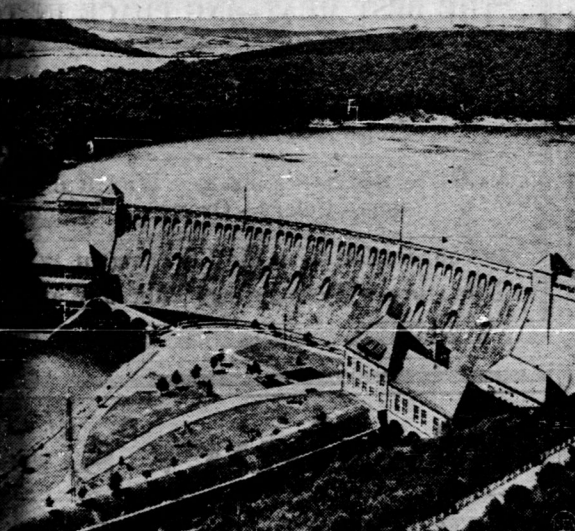
