INCOME TAX PAYMENTS  
EXTENDED TO AUGUST 31

Ottawa, April 10 — Time for payment of income tax has been extended from April 30 to August 31, Acting Revenue Minister MacKinnon announced today in the Commons. The 8th Victory Loan was a factor in the decision.

He tabled an Order-in-Council, passed today, making the change. Income tax returns still must be filed by April 30th, as was the case last year.

BUTTER PRODUCTION  
IS NOW INCREASING

Reports of a substantial increase in Ontario butter production during the month of February, over that of last year, and of still further increase being likely in March, are contained in the summary of the creamery instructors' reports to the Ontario Department of Agriculture. The greatest percentage increase, the reports state, has been in Southwestern Ontario, but practically all parts of the Province share in the upward trend of production. Northern Ontario anticipates a much larger make of butter in March than was the case a year ago, the production of milk in the district having increased substantially.

Producers report plenty of feed on hand, the report says, and with restrictions on fluid cream sales, a larger amount of fat is likely to be diverted to butter production. It is also interesting to note that there has been a noticeable improvement in cream quality.

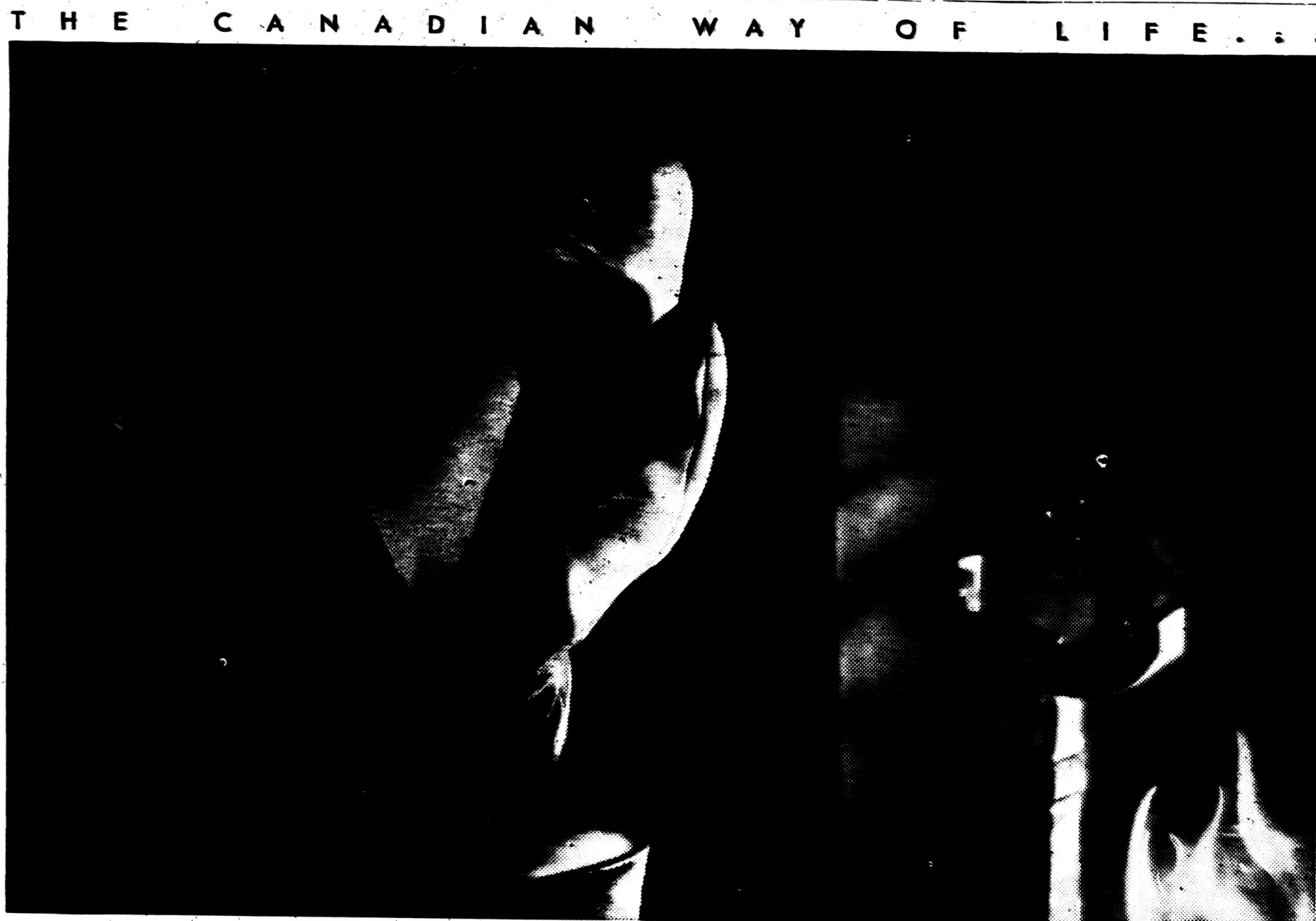
