

ARRANGEMENTS have been made by the Ontario Government for members of all the Armed Services overseas to vote in the coming Ontario election by placing a ballot in a ballot box for the candidate of their own choice The arrangements which have been r the Ontario vote are the best which have yet been made for any Active Service completed for the Ontario vote are the best which have yet been made for any Active Service vote. The Government, however, can only make the arrangements for taking the vote. What is equally important is that those who are overseas know the name of the candidates, the party they are supporting and have a sufficiently clear picture of the issues to decide how they should vote. That can only be done if those at home supply them with information. May I strongly urge every wife, mother, father, sister, brother or friend of those overseas to mewspapers, by editorial comment, and by personal explanation. By clippings from be given of what is really at stake in this Ontario election.

One of the things which will cause the greatest difficulty in the minds of those overseas, particularly those who live in large cities, is to determine which Riding they live in. Maps away from home for a long time, or as is true in so many cases has never voted before. This difficulty will be increased because of the difference between the boundaries of Dominion and Provincial Ridings.

I would suggest that you write immediately, by airmail, to all with whom you are in communication and tell them the Riding in which they live and give them what information you can about the party and the candidate in the Riding where they are entitled to vote.

I should mention that every member of the Armed Forces overseas of any age is entitled to vote. They, above all others have the right to vote. They have preserved for us that free job here at home is not only to make sure that they have the chance to vote but also to do worthing possible to make sure that they are able to vote with knowledge of the real everything possible to make sure that they have the chance to vote but also to do issues in the election.

For the sake of convenience, I am suggesting that you simply cut out this message and address it to someone overseas giving the information required. Each one of us here at home has a responsibility to help them to choose the Government which will have so much to do with not only to those closest to you but to as many as you know in any of the services outside the candidate and any further information you can supply.
