

FARMERS REMINDED ON POULTRY PRICES

Farmers who raise poultry are reminded that all sales to retail merchants, as well as sales in bulk to industrial, commercial and other buyers who purchase through any pooling arrangements must not exceed the wholesale ceiling price. It is only when deliveries are made separately to individual addresses that the retail ceiling applies. retail ceiling applies.




