When milk is in short supply, calves need some sort of supplement. There are plenty of calf meals on the market and most of them are good. One which can be made up at home includes corn meal 50 lbs., low grade flour 50 lbs., oil cake 25 lbs., oatmeal 25 lbs., powdered skim milk 25 lbs., bone meal 5 lbs. As a general rule, oonoe lb. (dry weight) of a calf meal is a fair substitute for 4½ qis. or 9 to 10 lbs. of skim milk. The meal should be made into a gruel or thick paste by adding a very small quantity of cold water. All lumps should be stirred out. Boiling water can then be added at the rate of 4½ qts. per lb. of milk used. This is fed warm, substituting for skim milk, pound for pound.
