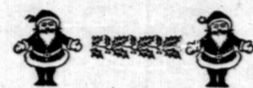

*On the Farm Front*

 The announcement last week that the butter ration is being cut to the extent of one ounce per person per week commencing January 1st is born out by a recent report showing the domestic disappearance of butter products during recent months. For instance, in October the per capita consumption was 2.86 lbs. as compared with 2.73 lbs. a year ago. Against this is a decrease of 12.9 per cent in the Canadian production of butter during the month of November. A matter of fact, decrease in production were recorded in all provinces.

 A visit to the local Farmers' Co-operative Poultry Processing Plant and seeing the poultry box-packed is sufficient to convince anyone of the sales appeal of having the poultry graded, not only for quality but also for size of bird. There is something attractive about a box of properly dressed poultry that is irrefragable. The creation of this sales appeal is a matter of importance to farmers since it will create a broader market for their product. It is interesting to note that Haldimand farmers are sufficiently advanced in their methods of marketing their product to create this sales appeal.

 Haldimand hog producers practically blew the lid off in October when they marketed 1038 Grade A carcasses out of a total of 2017 carcasses. This is at the rate of 51.46 per cent. No other County came anywhere near this percentage. Time has not yet permitted a complete analysis of the whole Province.

 When milk is in short supply calves need some sort of supplement. There are plenty of calf meals on the market and most of them are good. One which can be made up at home includes corn meal 50 lbs., low grade flour 20 lbs., cake 25 lbs., oatmeal 25 lbs., powdered skim milk 25 lbs., bone meal 5 lbs. As a general rule, some 1b (dry weight) of a calf meal is a fair substitute for 4 1/2 qts. or 9 to 10 lbs. of skim milk. The meal should be made into a gruel of thick paste by adding a very small quantity of cold water. All lumps should be stirred out. Boiling water can then be added at the rate of 4 1/2 qts. per lb. of milk used. This is fed warm, substituting for skim milk, pound for pound.

**FLOATER SYSTEM**
