



Thus an application of lime is not only beneficial in itself, but it also gives the crop a better chance to get the full benefit of any fertilizer you apply.

Furthermore, the organic content of the soil increases where lime is used. Haldimand soils are sally lacking in organic matter. Besides being a reservoir for holding moisture on which a plant can draw, organic matter also improves the mechanical condition of heavy soils such as ours.
