The fate of Prime Minister Church ill's government was decided by the British electorate Thursday, but the result of the voting will not be known until July 26—three weeks after the election. Pending news of the success or failure of the Labor Party's bid for power, Mr. Churchill left Britain for a short vacation abroad before going to the big three conference in Potsdam.

As Britain's election fever died down the European political front was relatively quiet. Italy took advantage of the lull to make her bid for a spot in the Big Three's postwar plans. The Italian cabinet expressed hope that the next conference of the powers would abolish the 1944 armistice and grant Italy status which would allow her to engage in what the Italians term "greater international co-operation".
