According to Acting Health Commissioner Frank A. Calderone of New York City, no substance has yet been discovered to protect people from the poison if they ome in contact with the plant. The only way to escape is to avoid Poison ivy is easy to identify.

It is a shrub or vine which usor runs along old stone walls. The leaves always grow in groups of three. Their color is a handsome reddish bronze in the early Spring, a deep rich green in the Summer and russet in the Fall. The plant bears clusters of whitish, waxy
