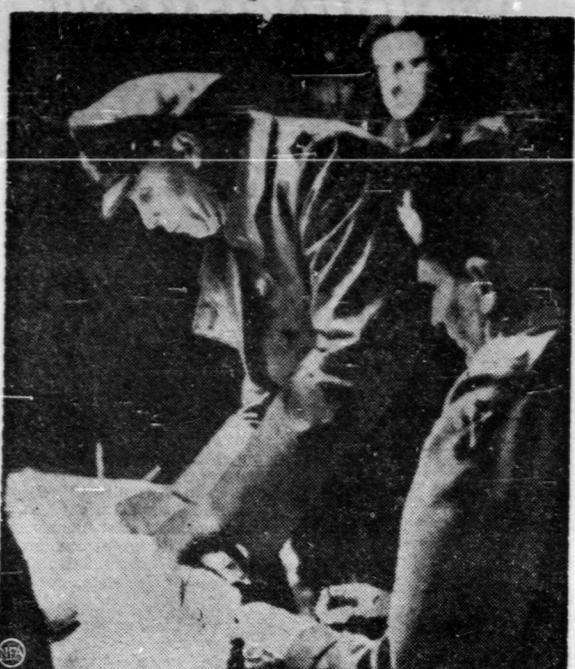


## SURRENDER TO MONTGOMERY

## OTTAWA REPORTS

That Munitions Minister Howe Forecasts Minimum Disturbance In Conversion From War To Peace In Canada

Based on information sent the United Kingdom and the United States, the immediate war production picture in Canada was that aircraft production would continue indefinitely, and there would continue to be a high rate of delivery of ships well into 1946. Production of railway equipment would be stepped up to supply domestic and foreign demands. There would be a slack in explosives in line with ammunition demands, but chemicals for agricultural and other in industrial needs would continue at a high rate. Gun and small arms ammunition would be cut progressively. Armored vehicles production would be reduced sharply. There would be partial conversion in automotive vehicles from military to civilian requirements. War production would keep factories fully engaged. War and civilian demands would keep production of raw and semi-processed materials high.

Production of civilian necessities, together with production of exports to liberated countries, would absorb manpower released by the lessening of war production. Mr. Howe said he paid tribute to the excellent plans laid by most of Canada's industries for the period just beginning and stated that in many of these reconversion would mean simply the moving of workers from one machine to another.

Canada will have a carry over of about 300,000,000 bushels of wheat at the end of the crop year, July 31, and the United States, about 200,000,000 the Dominion Bureau of Statistics estimates. This would be the lowest midsummer figure since 1910.

Officials from Dominion Department of Agriculture, accompanied by United States Department of Agriculture representatives, will go to Fort William later this month to observe tests being made in the Niagara region to destroy the Spruce Sawfly. RCAF personnel will be observing the tests. DDT insecticide on timber stands there in experimental tests.

## Canadian Lumber For British Homes

The British government has already earmarked around \$150,000,000 for timber from Canada for delivery following the cessation of hostilities, states The Calgary Herald. Filling of this huge order may prevent the inauguration of home building operations in this country on the scale needed, but British necessity is greater than that of Canada, who have not had one home demolished by enemy action throughout the war.
