

JAPS FAIL IN ATTEMPTS TO KILL SEALS

One of the United States Government's most valuable possessions, the fabulous scal skin business worth approximately \$100,000,000 to the U. S. Treasury with its secret formula for processing, has been rescued from Jap trickery and armed attempts to take it.

Announcement of this victory comes from U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service with the revelation that the herd, depleted by Jap raids, has been restored to 3,000,000 scals. Also revealed for the first time is the Jap attempt to steal the jealously guarded secret processing formula just before Pearl Harbor.

The Fouke Fur Company of St. Louis, Mo., uses the formula in trust for the Government. More than 90 per cent of all seal skins in the world used for milady's fur, coats are handled by this company. The process is one of the most carefully guarded industrial secrets that exists.
